NEW LECTIONARIES: The books that contains all the readings we use at Mass is being changed. As you know the original language of Sacred Scriptures were Hebrew and Greek. Jesus spoke Aramaic. SOLEMNITY OF THE HOLY TRINITY

Entrance antiphon: Blessed be God the Father, and the Only Begotten Son of God, and also the Holy Spirit, for he has shown us his merciful love.

First Reading *"The Lord is God indeed: he and no other"* Deuteronomy: 4: 32 - 34, 39- 40

Moses said to the people: 'Put this question to the ages that are past, that went before you, from the time God created man on earth: Was there ever a word so majestic, from one end of heaven to the other? Was anything ever heard? Did ever a people hear the voice of the living God speaking from the heart of the fire, as you heard it, and remain alive?
